SAVVY WAYS TO AVOID CHRISTMAS WASTE



1. Rethink Your Wrapping

Australians go all out at Christmas, using over **150,000 km of wrapping paper.** This is enough to wrap around the Earth's equator almost four times!

But here's the catch: **most wrapping paper can't be recycled**, thanks to glitter, foil, and plastic coatings.



But don't worry, there are plenty of fun, low-waste alternatives:

- Fabric & Reusable Wraps: Try Furoshiki cloths, fabric scraps, or handmade drawstring bags for beautiful, reusable wrapping.
- **Paper Options:** Use kraft paper, scrap or newspaper, or repurposed shopping bags for simple, recyclable wrap.
- **Gift Within a Gift:** Wrap with a scarf, tote, tea towel, or box that becomes part of the present.



2. Save Money, Time, and the Planet with Secret Santa

Secret Santa is a win-win for your wallet, your sanity, and the planet!

Limiting each person to just one gift cuts down on clutter, packaging, costs, and the stress of buying multiple presents. It encourages thoughtful, useful gifts instead of expensive extras that might end up in landfill. Plus, handmade, upcycled, or regifted ideas make the tradition fun, budget-friendly, and low-waste all in one!

To make the process even easier, there are plenty of websites that can randomly assign Secret Santa matches when you simply enter everyone's email address — no more drawing names from a hat.

3. Share Love with Homemade gifts

Homemade gifts are a clever low-waste choice as they cut down on packaging, make use of repurposed materials, and create thoughtful, personalised presents your recipients will love.

Here are some ideas:

- Baked goods: Cookies, slices, or bread.
- Preserves: Jam, chutney, or preserves in recycled jars, decorated with twine or fabric scraps.
- **Self-care gifts**: Candles in recycled jars or tins, or bath salts, scrubs, and soaps made with natural ingredients in reusable containers.
- DIY coupons: For babysitting, home-cooked meals, mowing the lawn, washing the car etc.




4. DIY Christmas Decorations



Wreaths: Give your door an Aussie twist! Mount eucalyptus, bottlebrush, wattle, or other native greenery on a reused frame. Compost when done, or use recycled fabric strips for a reusable option.

Paper Chains: Turn old magazines, newspapers, or scrap paper into colourful paper chains for your tree, windows, or mantelpiece. It's a simple, nostalgic craft that's fun for all ages and a great way to decorate without the waste.



Dried citrus & Twine Garlands: Thread oven-dried orange, lemon, or lime slices onto twine or ribbon. They smell great and can be composted after the holidays.

Low-Waste Centrepieces: Upcycle old glass jars into glowing centrepieves by adding a tealight candle or solar lights. To complete the look, decorate the outside with pressed native leaves or twine.

Felt & Fabric Ornaments: Use fabric scraps or old clothes to make stars, hearts, trees, or any shapes you like. Reusable and full of character, they also make unique gifts or keepsakes.

5. Decorate with Festive Bunting
