CATEGORIES OF SIGNIFICANCE

1. Any tree of outstanding aesthetic quality.
2. Any tree outstanding for its large height, trunk circumference or canopy spread.
3. Any tree that is particularly old or venerable.
4. Any tree commemoration or having associations with an important historical event or person.
5. Any tree associated with a well-known public figure or ethnic group.
6. Any tree which occurs in a unique location or situation, or provides a significant contribution to the landscape, including landmarks and trees which form part of an historical garden, park or town.
7. Any tree that is of a rare species or a variety of very localised distribution.
8. Any tree which is of horticultural or genetic value and could be an important source of propagating stock.
9. Any tree which exhibits an unusual or unique physical feature.
10. Any group or avenue of trees conforming to any of the above criteria.
