We have lots of special trees in Serpentine Jarrahdale which are officially recognised as significant. They are some of our oldest, most distinctive or historically significant trees.

**Most significant trees are on public land, so you can visit them anytime you like.**

### 1. Abernethy Road tree tunnel



This is a very attractive avenue of *Casuarina obesa* (Swamp Sheoaks), which is significant to local community and used for wedding photography.

## 2. Cardup Siding Road (A)



*Eucalyptus marginata* (jarrah), very old, impressive tree with significant ecological value and character close to the edge of the road.

## 3. Cardup Siding Road (B)



*Eucalyptus marginata* (jarrah). This second tree is also very impressive and full of rural character. The road here was designed to deviate around the tree to protect it.

## 4. Baskerville Road and Keirnan Street junction



*Eucalyptus marginata* (jarrah). This tree is huge and thriving, despite the loss of a large limb, we estimate it to be around 450 years old!

## 5. Jarrahdale Road tree tunnel



A mixture of approximately 230 trees of various species, including *Eucalyptus marginata* (jarrah), *Corymbia calophylla* (marri) and introduced species such as *Eucalyptus robusta* (swamp mahogany) and *Acacia decurrens* (black wattle). The tunnel was nominated because of the lovely leafy welcome it offers visitors to Jarrahdale.

## 6. Jarrahdale Road, 420m east of Balmoral Road



*Eucalyptus marginata* (jarrah). This tree is a wonderful old individual we estimate to be around 525 years old. It features some habitat hollows.

## 7. Northwest of Balmoral Road junction, near Munda Bididi trail



*Eucalyptus marginata* (jarrah). This tree was nominated for its epic size and an estimated age of just over 300 years old.

## 8. Balmoral Road, close to the bridge



*Eucalyptus marginata* (jarrah). Nominated for its size and age, estimated to be around 200 years old.

## 9. Lowlands Road tree tunnel with approx. 600 trees



This tree tunnel features around 600 trees, mostly comprising four local species: *Casuarina obesa* (swamp sheoak), *Eucalyptus rudis* (flooded gum), *Melaleuca preissiana* (swamp paperbark) and *Corymbia calophylla* (marri). The tunnel was nominated because the combined beauty of the trees was highly valued by the local community and provide a range of ecological habitats for local wildlife.

Estimated age range: 2 - 200 years.

## 10. Lowlands Road tree tunnel, Mardella



Another tree tunnel on Lowlands Road. This one has around 470 trees, mostly *Casuarina obesa* (swamp sheoak) and *Eucalyptus rudis* (flooded gum). The tunnel was nominated for its beauty and the character it gives to the area.

## 11. Rapids Road tree tunnel



Large natural tunnel of *Eucalyptus rudis* (flooded gum) over the road. The trees and the canopy they form supports supports possums and frogs, and creates ecological linkage. Very attractive section of road. Estimated age up to 400 years.
