Social Media Awareness

With national legislation now in place restricting teenagers from accessing certain platforms, we encourage families to be mindful of account sharing, as this can contribute to ongoing issues. These laws were introduced to help reduce online bullying, and we hope the community embraces these changes to create safer digital environments for our young people.

Rangers Education Sessions

Our Ranger Education Program visits local schools, day cares and kindergartens to teach children about responsible pet ownership, how to safely interact with animals, and the role Rangers play in our community. Home secure is your home?

You can take simple steps to protect your home and belongings: lock all doors and windows, remove hidden spare keys, install deadlocks, and use alarms or sensor lighting.

Keep valuables out of sight, secure tools and ladders, and avoid leaving packaging from new purchases outside, which can signal opportunities to thieves.

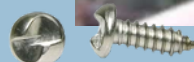

Secure your number plates

Thieves steal vehicle number plates and attach them to different vehicles. then they commit crimes and rack up vehicle-related fines without being identified through their own number plates. Please report any number plate theft to police as soon as you notice.

Secure your number plates with tamper-resistant screws to make them harder to steal.

Safe and Found WA

Safe & Found WA is an initiative introduced by Western Australia Police Force (WA Police Force) and Australia Medic Alert Foundation.

Safe & Found supports people living with dementia, autism or a cognitive impairment who might be at risk of becoming lost or reported as missing, by ensuring Police have immediate access to critical information to assist when undertaking search operations.

A detailed profile outlining your personal history and characteristics is completed ahead of time, and kept securely along with a recent photo, on the Safe & Found database for Police to access immediately if you go missing.

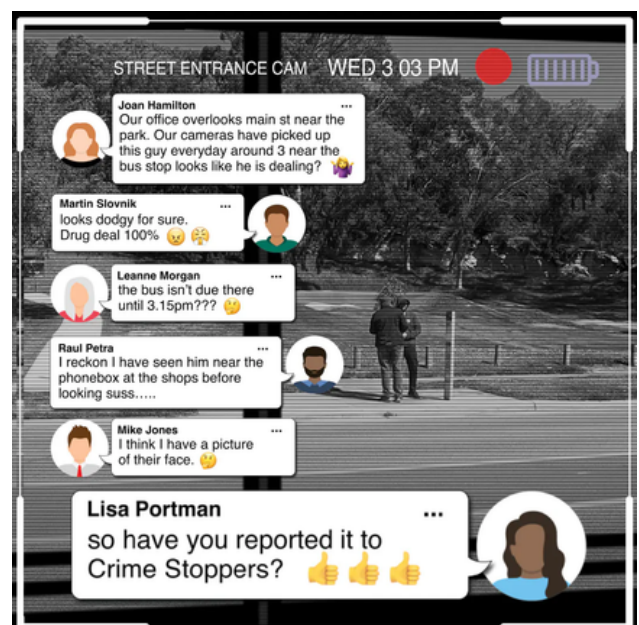
A Safe & Found ID bracelet is included with your membership to protect you when you're out in public. Your bracelet is engraved with the details needed to return you to safety should you appear lost or disoriented.

To Access:

- Scroll down the page to locate the dashboard section (similar to the image shown below)

Explore the Data:

- Select your suburb
- Choose the year
- Pick the type of crime (e.g., assault, theft, property damage)

Download Options:

- Export the filtered data into Excel (.xlsx) or PDF formats for further analysis or reporting

Crime statistics are updated on a quarterly basis in February, May, August and November. Offence count data is subject to revision as police investigations may not be finalised at the time the data is published.
