# ON THE BEAT

*June 2026 Update*

*with OIC Senior Sergeant Peta Jones*



Hello Serpentine Jarrahdale community members,

You may have noticed an increased police presence on local roads, with officers, including police motorcyclists, targeting speeding and other road safety offences. Please stay alert to speed-limit changes, particularly around construction and road work areas, obey posted speed zones and always drive to the conditions.

We are also encouraging owners of non-registerable off-road motorcycles to record their bikes with Bikelinc, a free community crime-prevention tool powered by Crime Stoppers WA. By linking a bike's serial number or VIN with the owner's details, Bikelinc can help police identify and return lost or stolen bikes more quickly. Taking a few minutes to create a profile is a simple step that can make a real difference in reducing the impact of bike theft in our local area.

Garage and property security also play an important role in preventing opportunistic theft. Residents are encouraged to keep garage doors closed and locked, secure internal access doors, avoid leaving garage remotes in vehicles parked outside, and consider options such as sensor lighting, CCTV, additional garage locks or anti-lift devices. Neighbours can also help by staying alert, checking in with each other and reporting suspicious activity around homes, garages, laneways or parked vehicles. A connected community is one of the best ways to prevent crime and protect local property.

Mundijong Police recently farewelled First Class Constable MALINOWSKA, who has transferred to regional Western Australia. After moving to Australia from overseas, she will now have the opportunity to experience the Western Australian outback while serving in Laverton.

We have also welcomed two new probationary officers to the Mundijong team, Constable Long and Constable Wilson who both completed the WA Police Cadet Program before progressing through recruit training to become sworn officers.

Most people know where the line is. This isn't harmless fun — it's reckless behaviour that puts others at risk and harms community assets.



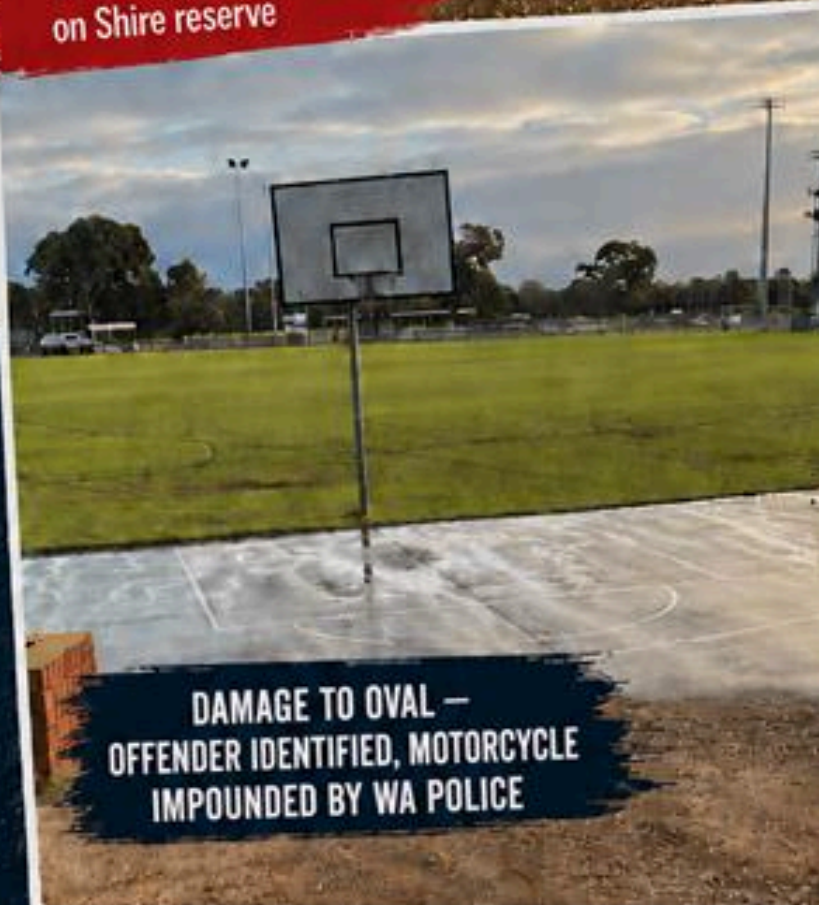
## ENFORCEMENT IS HAPPENING.

## Safer Parcel Delivery Options

We encourage residents to consider a range of simple steps to help prevent parcel theft and support a safer community.

### Use a Trusted Neighbour or Family Member

If you won't be home, ask someone you trust to accept your parcel on your behalf.

### Request a Signature on Delivery

When placing your order, select the option requiring a signature on delivery. This ensures your parcel won't be left unattended if no one is home.

### Use a 24/7 Parcel Locker (Free, Easy & Secure)

Parcel Lockers are a convenient and secure alternative to home delivery. Instead of having parcels left on your doorstep, they're stored safely in a locked compartment until you collect them.

## Secure your number plates

Thieves steal vehicle number plates and attach them to different vehicles. Then they commit crimes and rack up vehicle-related fines without being identified through their own number plates. If you don't report the licence plates as stolen as soon as possible, you can end up with the criminals fines.

Secure your number plates with tamper-resistant screws to make them harder to steal.

Our SJ Neighbourhood Watch team have these available for free at the Farmers Markets in Mundijong on the fourth Saturday each month.

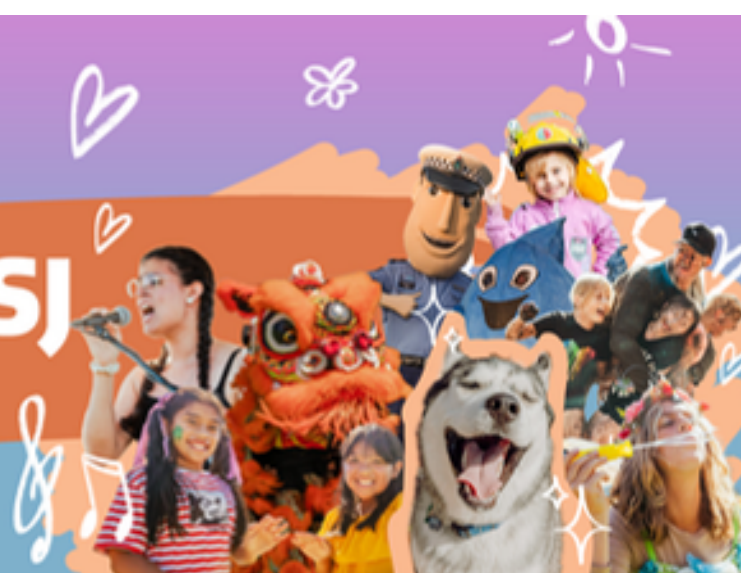

## Want to know what's happening in your neighbourhood?

Crime reports are now accessible via the [WA Police Crime Statistic Report website](#). Here you will find an interactive dashboard to manoeuvre and select statistics relevant to your suburb.

To Access:

- Visit the [website](#)
- Scroll down the page to locate the dashboard section (similar to the image shown below)

Explore the Data:

- Select your suburb
- Choose the year
- Pick the type of crime (e.g., assault, theft, property damage)

Download Options:

- Export the filtered data into Excel (.xlsx) or PDF formats for further analysis or reporting

Crime statistics are updated on a quarterly basis in February, May, August and November. Offence count data is subject to revision as police investigations may not be finalised at the time the data is published.
