To help prevent this, consider using 24/7 parcel lockers if you won't be home during delivery times, or arrange for someone you trust to receive the package on your behalf.

Our team is actively working to identify those responsible and has successfully charged two individuals who were following delivery vans and stealing packages.

We continue to seek the community's support in identifying suspects that commit these crimes.

During the festive season, please also remember to drive safely, avoid drinking and driving, and show respect on the roads. Let's all enjoy Christmas together responsibly.

Bike Safety

Keep Your Bike Safe with Bikelinc

If you own a bike, make sure you register it through Bikelinc, a free service powered by Crime Stoppers. Registration involves recording your bike's serial number, which helps police and the community return it to you in the unfortunate event that it is stolen.

Bikelinc is also a handy tool when buying a second-hand bike, allowing you to check that it's not listed as stolen property. Visit bikelinc.com.au to register your bike today and help keep our community safer.

Infringments for non compliance

Please note: legally speaking a bicycle is a vehicle, so all road laws that apply to vehicles apply to cyclists as well, unless they are expressly excluded.

Cyclists share the same rights and responsibilities as drivers and must obey the road rules. The following penalties apply to cyclists specifically.

Cyclist offences	Infringement
Not wearing a helmet	\$50
Failure to have at least one effective brake and working warning device	\$100
Failure to have correct lighting	\$100
Failure to ride only two abreast with up to 1.5m between riders.	\$50
Riding less than 2m behind a vehicle	\$100
Passing on the left of a vehicle that is turning left	\$100



Home Safety Audit Program

The Shire has recently introduced a Home Safety Audit, available via referrals from the District Police Office. This valuable service supports victims of crime by helping them feel more secure in their homes

You can also take simple steps to protect your home and belongings: lock all doors and windows, remove hidden spare keys, install deadlocks, and use alarms or sensor lighting.

Keep valuables out of sight, secure tools and ladders, and avoid leaving packaging from new purchases outside, which can signal opportunities to thieves.

The Shire also offers a subsidy on residential and business CCTV installations up to \$500.

For extra peace of mind, download the WA Police Home Security Self Audit Checklist to evaluate your home's safety and make improvements where needed.

CCTV Subsidy Program 2025/2026

Eligible residents and businesses can receive a oneoff payment of up to \$300 for DIY installations or up to \$500 for professionally installed security systems. Participants in the subsidy program may use the funds to upgrade an existing CCTV system, provided they meet certain technical requirements.

Cam-Map WA

Have you heard of Cam-Map WA?
One of the requirements for the CCTV
Subsidy Program is to register your public
facing camera to Cam-Map WA. This is
done online via their website. Cam-Map
WA is a database that is only accessible by
WA Police. They do not have access to the
cameras directly, only a list of locations
where the cameras are. This helps police
rapidly identify homes or businesses which
could have CCTV footage to support
investigations and respond more
effectively to incidents as they arise.

Crime reports are now accessible via the <u>WA Police Crime Statistic Report website</u>. Here you will find an interactive dashboard to manoeuvre and select statistics relevant to your suburb.

To Access:

- Visit the website
- Scroll down the page to locate the dashboard section (similar to the image shown below)


Explore the Data:

- Select your suburb
- Choose the year
- Pick the type of crime (e.g., assault, theft, property damage)

Download Options:

• Export the filtered data into Excel (.xlsx) or PDF formats for further analysis or reporting

Crime statistics are updated on a quarterly basis in February, May, August and November. Offence count data is subject to revision as police investigations may not be finalised at the time the data is published.


