5. Agency Reports:

5.1. Shire of Serpentine Jarrahdale

5.1.1. Karrakup Bushfire Complex – Activation of Byford Evacuation Centre January 2025

The Karakup Complex of Fires in January 2025 resulted in the activation of the Byford evacuation centre. Following the incident, the following feedback was collected in relation to this activation:

- 1. Open communication between DFES, Dep. Communities, and the Shire was effective, the Dep. Communities on-call was notified promptly and able to gather all required information
- 2. Provision of Shire Staff in assistance of Communities worked really well and ensured the facility was activated smoothly and without issue.
- 3. Likewise, the Shire staff felt that the training provided by Communities was beneficial in this activation. Further training will continue to be offered by Communities.
- 4. Painting works in the centre did limit the full capacity, however this was not an issue on the day.
- 5. The centre address "38 Mead St" is advertised on Emergency WA and other platforms, however is not signposted at the evacuation centre. It was noted that the Shire will be installing Electronic Signage at the center that may be able to provide supplementary signage during emergency incidents in the future.

5.1.2. State Recovery Arrangements in the State Emergency Management Framework

The Department of Fire and Emergency Services has proposed a number of revisions to the State Recovery Arrangements. The Shire is seeking LEMC comments and feedback for incorporation into the Shire's response. Factsheets provided - **attachment 1 and 2**.

5.2. Shire President

Thanked CESM and WAPOL for LEMC exercise in December.

Karrakup Bushfire – thanked career and volunteer Fire Fighters. Communications to the public were outstanding. Evacuation Centre set up worked exceptionally well. All agencies worked collaboratively and expressed thanks on behalf of the Shire.

New Oakford Station tender has now been awarded, and work is expected to progress soon.

5.3. Karnet Prison Farm

Mark Cundell updated that the Karnet Prison Farm total muster increased by 15%, to 412 people.

5.4. Armadale Kalamunda Group

A busy season of fire and emergency related incidents in the last 12 months.

5.5.1. Local Emergency Relief and Support Plan

5.6. St John Ambulance

Reiterated the change of hours with new leadership structure. Provided an overview of the districts and who is responsible for those areas.

5.7. Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions

No report provided.

5.8. Department of Fire and Emergency Services

Overall, normal fire risk conditions are expected for all WA during the Autumn outlook period.

Continuing from the summer trend, large areas of southern WA are experiencing rainfall deficiencies that have compounded since spring 2023. Combined with higher fuel loads across the scarp due to extended drought conditions from the past few years indicates that firefighters may still be responding to fires in the lead up to winter.

The deficit moisture levels in the soil may in turn impact when fuel reduction prescribed burning activities may start. Without significant rainfall may result in a shorter duration in which to undertake prescribed burning activities.

The MAF Grants Program 2025/26 Round 1 will open on 18 March 2025 with a close date of 12 noon 29 April 2025. DFES has just announced the use of Remote Pilot Vehicles (Drones) for fire response operations when other aircraft are not available i.e. nighttime intel operations.

Fire Incident Response Financial Year 2024/25.

Cardup Career Fire and Rescue Station opened in January 2025 which has increased the fire response across the region with Cardup CFRS attending 62 incidents in the Shire of Serpentine Jarrahdale District.

Byford BFB 92 incidents.

Emergency Support Brigade 7 incidents.

Jarrahdale BFB 38 incidents.

Keysbrook BFB 16 incidents.

Shire of Serpentine Jarrahdale Staff and Brigades have supported DFES and other Local Government across the Country with deployments to Victoria, Chittering, Dongara, Cervantes, Gingin, Northam, Rockingham and Skeleton Rock in the Goldfields.

1 significant Level 2 bushfire in Byford area with 5 ignitions following a storm. These incidents were investigated by Strike Force Vulcan and Arson Squad and deemed most likely started by lightning.

5.9. District Emergency Management Advisor

Noted the report of the CESM and accepted the draft tabled. Commended the overview of the lessons learned and how they can now be implemented into the local emergency management plan.

State emergency preparedness report and state emergency management plan both delayed due to election period.

Resilience Australia Awards 2025 nominations are now open. Invitations will be circulated.

5.10. State Emergency Services

SES very active on deployments in the East and North and in the Kalamunda hills area this quarter.

5.11. Mundijong Police

New OIC Peta Jones. Station focus now is dealing with antisocial behaviors and illegal camping issues.

Armadale FTE capacity is now full and positioning to move officers to the new Baldivis Police Station due to open in May.

5.12. Chief Bush Fire Control Officer

Prevention

 Ongoing mitigation works including Mechanical mulching works have been undertaken in reserves around the LG

Preparedness

- Community BBQ nights have been attended by Shire staff, ESD and Volunteers
- Met with the monastery to help them with their plan to stay and defend and during medium threat period we will take brigades to the monastery for a familiarisation on water points and access in the event of a fire

Response

 Across the Shire, compared to the same time last year the brigade have been to 68 small bushfire compared to 57 this time last year, however the brigades at the time of reporting have only attended 7 large bushfires compared to 14 this time last year. In total the



brigades have attended 249 incidents vs 260 last year in total, this includes DBA's, Rubbish/Vehicle fires, Structure fires and rescues. There have been 23 RCR's in the Shire.

- Cardup CFRS came online 1st February, the brigades have attended a number of incident with Cardup across the Shire
- The brigades have assisted at a number of large fires outside of the Shire including Champion Lakes, Cervantites, Mundaring Bushfires, Laverton Bushfire, Skeleton Rock, Gin Gin Complex, as well as sent volunteers to Victoria

Seasonal Outlook Overview

The areas marked in red on the map represent an increased risk of fire, largely driven by very dry conditions in the lead up to autumn, combined with increased amount of

bushfire fuel to burn. Temperatures are also predicted to continue to remain above normal for most of the country.

AFAC CEO Rob Webb said: "The same dry conditions that have seen recent fires in Victoria and in WA look set to continue across much of the southern coastline of mainland Australia."

"It means that the fire season in these areas may go a little longer this year."

"Local fire authorities across Australia are monitoring bushfire risk this season so you can be ready to act if there is an emergency. Many agencies will also commence prescribed burning throughout autumn to help mitigate risk for the coming months and years."

Communities are encouraged to be vigilant and stay alert. It doesn't matter what time of year, dangerous fires can still occur, even during normal bushfire seasons.

This Seasonal Outlook was developed by AFAC, the Bureau of Meteorology, Queensland Fire Department, NSW Rural Fire Service, ACT Emergency Services Agency, ACT Parks and Conservation Service, Country Fire Authority, Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action VIC, Tasmania Fire Service, SA Country Fire Service, Department of Fire and Emergency Services, Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions WA, and Bushfires NT.
