5. Agency Reports:

5.1 Shire of Serpentine Jarrahdale

Additional Evacuation Centre Resources for Animal Welfare

The Shire has taken delivery of collapsible Dog and Cat containment cages for the holding of pets when Community Evacuation Centres are established in times of emergency incidents.

The intent of the cages is to provide a safe and secure environment when members of the community are evacuated from an area affected by, or under threat from an emergency incident such as fires and floods.

Although animals will be outside of the Centre itself, the animals will be housed in the cages and accommodated in an area directly adjoining the Centre. This means that



families can care for, and connect with their animals in a safe environment, knowing their beloved dogs and cats are safe and comfortable. It is important to keep the family unit together at a stressful time and will have a significant positive impact on evacuees and will provide a way forward once the Recovery phase of an incident has commenced.

Funding for the program has been a partnership between WALGA and the Shire, whereby 55 cages, a microchip scanner and cage identification tags have been acquired and will be stored in various locations for ready access by staff for transport to the designated Emergency Evacuation Centre.

Officers are currently procuring a trailer to contain resources for activation.

Emergency NBN at SJ Community Recreation Centre

The Shire of Serpentine Jarrahdale has again been successful in receiving funding from the Commonwealth Government for the provision of an NBN fixed satellite service to the Serpentine Jarrahdale Community Recreation Centre in Byford. This facility is the Shire's primary evacuation/welfare centre. Previously, we have received this funding for an installation at Bruno Gianatti Hall in Jarrahdale.

This installation is designed to provide internet access and the ability to make phone calls for 40 community members concurrently using the service during emergency events. Some larger communities will have a service installed that can cater for up to 100 concurrent users. The service operates all the time in "standby" mode giving basic throttled access, and when an emergency event occurs, the service is expanded to "fully activated" for the duration of the emergency.

Installation dates have not been established but are expected to occur in the December quarter.

Investigating funding for generator to welfare centre

Officers are looking at funding opportunities to source a backup generator for the primary welfare centre in the Shire.

State Risk Workshop

Shire Officers attended the Risk Workshops for Storm and Flood on 27 August 2021 as part of the State Risk Project.

The Shire is hosting the Rail Crash Workshop on 29 September from 9am to 12.30pm. Several local governments will be attending.



5.2 Shire President

The Shire President welcomed the Shire's new CESM and Chief Bush Fire Control Officer, Leigh Mulholland.

Karnup Road culvert failure from recent storm has resulted in a closure to Karnup Road for at least six months east of the Serpentine township.

There was a recent social media attack on one of the Shire's Bushfire Brigade Volunteers. The volunteer has been visited by the Shire President and Cr Rich expressed that all volunteers are appreciated for what they do.

With local government elections coming up on 16 October, the Shire President thanked all LEMC members for their work during the time she has been Chairperson.

5.3 Karnet Prison Farm

Planning underway for a refresher on Water Bombing training.

According to the COVID-19 Pandemic Phase 5 requirements, Karnet has no restrictions on visitors and is undertaking business as usual.

The local equine community attempted to contact the Shire after hours to advise their intent to provide horse evacuation facilities at the Serpentine Sports Reserve. This message was received in the morning however the facility was already in use and availability shared by the Clubs via social media.

There was no formal request from the IMT for the facility to be open which caused concerns for human welfare management at the facility.

The Shire now have arrangements with the Serpentine Horse and Pony Club, and they will contact Helen Sarcich directly who will liaise with the ISG. If the grounds are required, the Club will be notified, and the Shire will provide human and animal welfare support as required.

State News

New National Recovery and Resilience Agency

A National Recovery and Resilience Agency will commence on 1 July 2021. The agency will help local communities respond to large-scale disasters and provide support during the relief and recovery phases following major disasters. It will also undertake new initiatives to manage the impact of future events and the changing climate.

The National Recovery and Resilience Agency will be led by Coordinator-General Shane Stone and bring together the former National Drought and North Queensland Flood Response and Recovery Agency and the National Bushfire Recovery Agency, including the \$2 billion National Bushfire Recovery Fund.

The Agency will have its 'boots on the ground' through a national network of Recovery Support Officers who live and work in communities across Australia. These Officers are my eyes and ears and will make sure people get the information they need and direct them to the help and support that's right for their situation. We will also continue to provide advice back to the highest levels of Government about what is working and what needs to be improved, aiming to streamline and simplify the recovery process.

The Agency will work in close partnership with local councils, health services, charities, our federal and state government partner agencies and peak industry bodies.

The partnership will have an important role in driving efforts to minimise the impact of future disasters.



CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

The Department of Health is continuing to work under a State Emergency Declaration to manage COVID-19.

New Bill to extend timeframe for COVID-19 response measures

- Omnibus Bill to be introduced into Parliament to help keep WA safe and strong
- Bill will seek a further six-month extension for COVID-19 legislative amendments
- It will allow the McGowan Government to effectively respond and deal with unprecedented challenges of the pandemic, which pose an ongoing threat to the community.

An Omnibus Bill will be introduced into State Parliament to extend the timeframe for the COVID-19 legislative amendments and help keep Western Australians safe.

The Bill amends the Emergency Management Amendment (COVID-19 Response) Act 2020 and the Criminal Code Amendment (COVID-19 Response) Act 2020, which have been vital to the State's successful management of the virus.

The amendments will continue to give authorised officers the power to direct a person to take any action reasonably necessary to prevent, control or abate risks associated with COVID-19.

The new Bill will seek to extend those necessary provisions for another six months from July 4, 2021 to January 4, 2022.

2021-22 National Disaster Risk Reduction (NDRR)- Competitive Grant Program - NOW OPEN

The second round of the WA 2021-22 NDRR Competitive Grant Program is now open and applications are encouraged.

The NDRR Competitive Grant Program is a key component of the WA Implementation Plan to address the National Disaster Risk Reduction Framework priorities, five-year outcomes and 2030 goals.

Projects must address at least one Commonwealth NDRRF priority, demonstrate one or more of the 11 action areas within the WA Implementation Plan and address at least one natural hazard.

2021 Metropolitan District Emergency Management Committees (DEMC) Combined Trials

In late June the metropolitan District Emergency Management Advisors met with WA Police Force Acting Assistant Commissioner Metropolitan Greg Knott, the Chairs of the trial North and South meetings, Commander Mike Bell and Commander Noreen O'Rourke to consider the options for the next round of meetings.

The evaluation of the trial meetings didn't provide a clear direction going forward and it was agreed a further trial is required before any decisions can be made on the future of the metropolitan DEMC formats. There will be 2 DEMC meetings held on a day with a joint pre-season forum in between meetings each day. The WA Police Force are committed to the additional trials and will be chairing both DEMC meetings on relevant days.

- **Tuesday 12 October 2021- *North Meeting*** (Central & North DEMCs)
- **Tuesday 26 October 2021- *South Meeting*** (East & South DEMCs)

Two separate DEMC meetings (Central and North and East and South) will be hosted on the one day. One in the morning, the other in the afternoon with both committees attending a Emergency management Pre-season Forum – Wooroloo Bushfire Recovery- Looking Back, Looking Forward in-between each meeting.

Local news

South District Emergency Risk Management Workshops

A Storm & Flood Workshop was delivered on Wednesday 25 August 2021 – hosted by Rockingham Local Government. The workshop was successful with DFES District Officer SES Steve Summerton creating scenarios for the 8 local governments who participated in the workshop.

On Wednesday 29 September 2021 a further workshop – Rail Crash will be delivered - hosted by Serpentine/Jarrahdale Local Government. The workshop is expecting 7 local governments to attend with the support of Public Transport Authority Moreno Parrella creating the scenarios.

DODP Exercises

DFES facilitate a District Officer Development Program (DODP) which provides District Officers with the key functions and day to day business required in the role of a District Officer.

One of their roles is as an Incident Controller. To further develop their skills, the officers are required to Chair a simulated Incident Support Group (ISG) meeting/exercise.



The ISG consists of representatives (Liaison Officers) from organisations involved in the incident and relevant service providers. The function of the ISG is to assist the Incident Controller through the provision of information, expert advice, support and resources relevant to their organisation.

The first round of DODP exercises in August was attended by several local government personnel with very positive feedback. The second round of the program provides an opportunity for a representative from your local government (Local Recovery Coordinator, LEMC Executive Officer, Councillor) to attend one of the below sessions to gain exposure and an insight into the workings of an ISG. Several emergency services agencies will also be attending for personal development.

5.10 State Emergency Services

The recent storm event resulted in 16 calls for assistance for flooding, damage and trees.

It was noted that of the houses experiencing flooding, artificial turf was installed around the house and this was preventing the absorption of water into the ground causing ingress into homes.

Local SES Manager was recently deployed to Meekatharra for 5 days to assist in a search and rescue.

Several calls to rescue people from Kitty's Gorge Trail. Poor communication signals in the area is hampering response times. Having regular trail markers and a mapped trail would assist.

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5.11 Mundijong Police

WA Police share the concerns of the SES Manager regarding rescuing trail walkers.

To assist in overcoming the communications black spots in the Shire, Mundijong Police now have 3 satellite sleeves for their mobile phones. These are currently being trialed within the area.

Three new Senior Officers have commenced at the station and are working to familiarise themselves with the community.



5.12 Chief Bush Fire Control Officer

Prevention

- Mitigation Activity Funding works have commenced on the Jarrahdale Communication Tower site with a 20m Asset Protection Zone being implemented. Spraying of drains has been undertaken prior to slashing and uplifting of vegetation
- The Shire were awarded \$288,000 for Round 1 of 2021/22 Mitigation Activity Funding (MAF)
- In addition to the above, Council has contributed \$234,000 funds towards mitigation activities that are not eligible for MAF.
- Schedules have been developed to ensure works from previous MAF are maintained.
- Council have approved another full-time position for ESD. This position will be a second mitigation officer, who will be commencing in the coming weeks.
- Officers have met with Karnet Prison Farm to commission works on Shire managed lands utilising Karnet's Section 95 program. These works will consist of mechanical works within Millbrook Estate, Jarrahdale and hydrant servicing in Byford.
- Officers are preparing a 20-year Facilities Plan for the Shire's six Bushfire Brigades and SES Unit which will guide the strategic direction of future LGGS Capital Grant Applications. Officers are communicating with Brigades, who are providing input.
- Officers have redesigned the Shire's Firebreak Notice. This notice is now easier to read and contains only the regulatory requirement. A Bushfire Information Booklet will now be a separate document, full of educational and informative topics.
- Fire information sessions being held by our Bushfire Safety Awareness team. This is being conducted via Community BBQ's, SJ Farmers Market and Bushfire Planning workshops being held at the SJ Community Resource Centre.

Preparedness

- Training calendar had to be heavily modified due to trainer availability, the training team has plans to ensure the calendar can be more robust next season.
- Approximately twenty volunteers have attended training courses
- Rural Urban Interface (RUI) exercise planned for Saturday 30 October 2021 from 0900hrs to 1400hrs. This will be structured as a bushfire impacting the Cardup area.
- Bushfire Awareness Team and Jarrahdale Brigade will be running a community engagement event in Millbrook Estate prior to fire season, date TBC.
- Three First Aid courses have been scheduled for volunteers.
- Brigade Preseason Brief has been scheduled for the end of October.
- Emergency Support Brigade to attend the DFES South East regions pre-season "Exercise Tulip", this will give the brigade an opportunity to network with the region's Incident Management Team personnel.
- All hydrants within the Shire have been serviced.
- Officer in Charge training to be conducted with Brigades prior to fire season



- Mitigation Officer has completed Machine Operator training and will be utilised during fire season for afterhours machine operations at fires.

Response

- Brigades have responded to 172 incidents since the last LEMC meeting. (see table below)
- Byford are responsible for several Direct Brigade Alarms (DBA) within their area. These are premises where fire alarms connect directly to the Brigade such as Woolworths & Coles. To build capacity within Brigades, Oakford and Mundijong are in the process of receiving on the job training to respond to this type of alarm.
