Dear Paul,

Thank you for your time to meet with me and discuss the Abernethy mother and girls sculpture.

At our meeting last night members resolved to support the proposal for a sculpture of the three Abernethy girls and their mother to be placed on the roundabout in Abernethy Road adjacent to Woolworths, by artist Len Zuks who has created all the other sculptures on South Western Highway through Byford.

The proposal is for a cluster of 3 figures and 1 not attached, at a height of 3 metres at its highest point. Construction to be of 1.6 and 3mm plates, galvanised and painted, with an internal framework of pipe, with certification provided by an engineer. The structure will continue below ground and be cemented in. The exact placement to be to Council specifications. An historical plaque will also be provided. The artists attached proposal can be altered to Council's requirements.

The total cost will be \$30,000 of which \$15,000 will be funded by the Progress Association.

As previously discussed, when this proposal is accepted by council, the artist will provide a formal quote, drawings and specifications at no extra cost, before entering into a contract with Council, as he has done in the past.

Members also resolved to support the placement of a sculpture of myself, the 'Byford Bag Lady', in George St, as per the attached plan and photograph. The sculpture was created by Len Zuks some time ago at the request of members and has already been funded by a Byford resident. It is 2.5 tall and will stand on a plinth of old Byford State Brickwork's bricks 350mms high. It has yet to be painted. As above formal drawings and specifications, certified by an engineer will be provided before a contract is entered into.

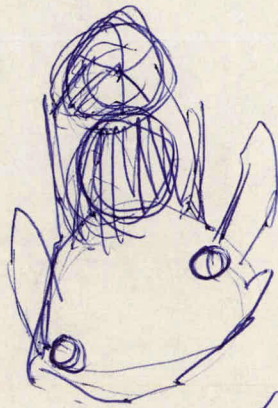

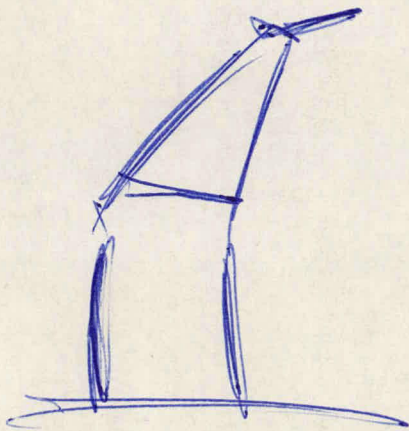

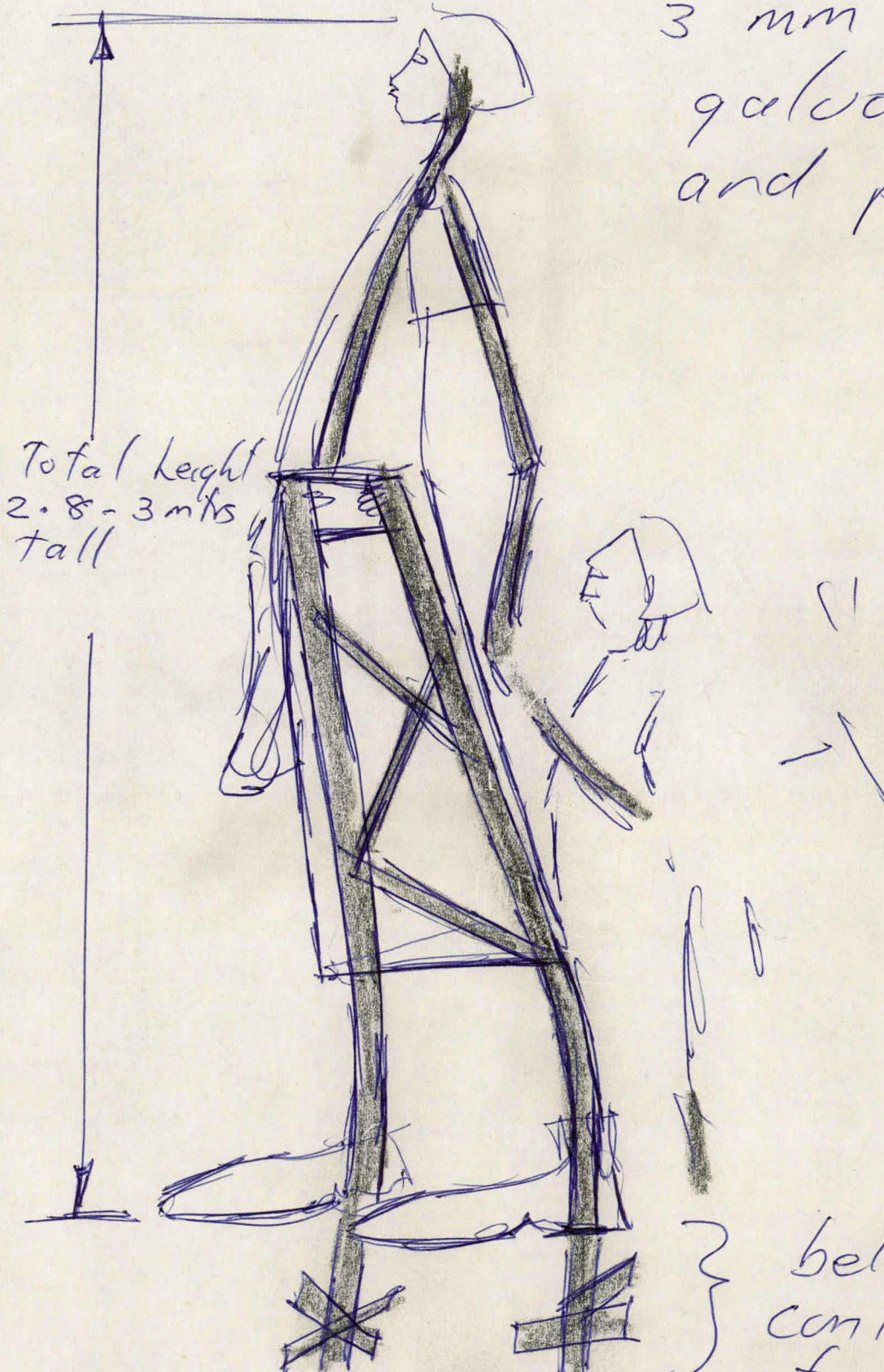

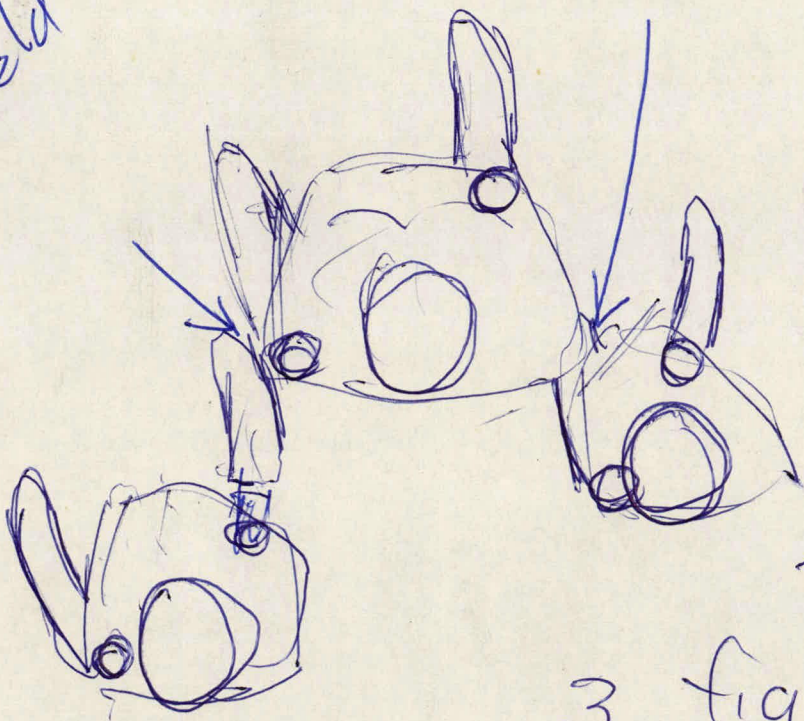
