## Horse Arena

Horse arenas are an excellent way to train your horse and hone both of your skills. Arenas can be a variety of sizes, depending on your required use, but a standard size for a dressage arena is $60 \mathrm{~m} \times 20 \mathrm{~m}$.

The area that has been fenced off separately and constructed as an arena on this property is $56 \mathrm{~m} \times 70 \mathrm{~m}$, that allows for two dressage sized arenas.

You can see that on one side, there are a few jumps set up for use, and the other side has been set up for use as a dressage arena.

This particular arena has had corrugated iron placed on the eastern and western sides in order to try and reduce the impact of the intense easterly winds. Trees have also been planted to assist in the aesthetics of the site and to create future shade and create a break from the wind.

The base of this arena has been constructed using a cracker dust base with a sand and rubber mulch (RubberGem) mix as the top layer. The rubber mix has been used as a trial to hold the arena material against movement from the intense easterlies that are experienced at this location.
