## The Study

The Shire of Serpentine-Jarrahdale commissioned CATALYSE® to conduct a MARKYT® Community Scorecard during October 2020.

Scorecard invitations were sent to 4,000 randomly selected households; 2,000 by mail and 2,000 by email.


**422** randomly selected residents and ratepayers completed a scorecard reducing the sampling error to ±4.73% at the 95% confidence interval.

The Shire of Serpentine-Jarrahdale provided supporting promotions through its communication channels. A further 603 residents, 12 out of area ratepayers and visitors, and 15 Council affiliated respondents participated bringing the total to **1,052 respondents**.

As analysis of results showed significant differences between these groups, the main body of this report presents responses from the random sample of residents only.

The final dataset was weighted by age and gender to match the ABS Census population profile.

Data has been analysed using SPSS. Where sub-totals add to  $\pm 1\%$  of the parts, this is due to rounding errors to zero decimal places.



## MARKYT Industry Standards

CATALYSE® has conducted studies for 60+ councils. When councils ask comparable questions, we publish the high and average scores to enable participating councils to recognise and learn from the industry leaders. 










#### **Net Promoter Score**







## Building and maintaining local roads

#### **Challenges**

- Local roads are in poor condition, with some sections of road perceived to be unsafe to drive on
- Concern that roads cannot handle increased traffic from population growth
- Main roads need improvement e.g. Thomas Road, South West Hwy
- Concerns about the railway crossing on Abernethy Rd

#### **Community Driven Actions**

- 1. More regular maintenance of Shire roads, fix potholes, tidy up road shoulders
- 2. Improve management of road works to ensure that repairs are carried out correctly
- 3. Upgrade roads and intersections
- 4. Consult with the community about road planning and congestion issues

#### **Community Voices**

"The condition of poor roads and busy intersections needs traffic lights. In the 4 years I've been here there is a lot more houses being built and roads cannot cope at peak hour."

"The roads are in a poor state of repair all over the shire and even the quality of the new roads/upgrades are below satisfactory standard."

"Roads are very poor and dangerous."

"Improve roads as there's plenty of potholes all around the roads."

"Fix old roads. Edge maintenance - shoulder."

"Fix the potholes at the bend on Thomas Road near South West Highway, it literally almost pulls your car off the road or onto oncoming traffic and is so dangerous."

"Abernethy Rd works is still quite poor, needs maintaining. Jarrahdale Road re-surfacing has left it in far worse condition, not an issue but a large waste of money and resource."

"Stop patching my road and do a proper resurface. More patches than road now."

"Fix the roads properly, the roads in this shire are disgusting to drive on, and they conduct, at best, shoddy repairs that do not last, and again have to repaired and repaired again."

"Make sure roads are good (right now Abernethy Road rail crossing is terrible). When works are done, work with local affected residents (the impact on Bradley Close and residents as part of Abernethy Road upgrade was terrible)."

## Value for money from Council rates

#### **Challenges**

- · Council rates are perceived to be too high
- Residents feel that they are receiving little service compared to the rates they pay

#### **Community Driven Actions**

- 1. Lower rates
- Manage finances more effectively to control costs
- Provide more services in return for rates (e.g. improve roads, footpaths, lighting, drainage, rubbish collections, parks)

#### **Community Voices**

"Rates are so high for the lack of anything the Shire does."

"Possibly reduction of rates as they seem high and make it hard for families to afford."

"Apart from our bins being collected, not sure what else our rates go towards."

"Keep land rates fair. Some properties only have power, no other services, why are they paying high rates?"

"Those of us that live on properties and have done for a number of years have been slugged with huge rate increases but very little extra in the way of services."

"The Shire needs to stop wasting money on stupid things and improve the roads and general maintenance in the Shire."

"The service and to our area in particular is terrible, we virtually get nothing for our rates other than a basic rubbish collection service, and we are paying circa \$3500 a year? They can not even keep our verges mowed or our streets swept, little to no interest in keeping our area looking good or providing a "Service"!"

"Simply better value for the extremely high rate charges we pay.

Drainage, footpaths, ant control."

"Verge collection has been taken away and rates are still the same no reduction."

"For the amount of rates being paid, providing services to ratepayers would be beneficial. We have very limited facilities and services for what we pay in rates. There are no (or poor) basic community services provided in the Shire such that we frequent facilities in the City of Armadale and/or Gosnells despite paying SJ Shire for such facilities/services."



## Community Action Plan Streetscapes

#### **Challenges**

- Overgrown vegetation on verges, roadsides and Shire land – makes the area look untidy, and creates fire and traffic hazards
- Verges in housing developments are not maintained, some areas were never finished

#### **Community Driven Actions**

- 1. Pruning bushes and trees, mowing, weed control and cleaning up debris on roadsides
- 2. Cleaning up rubbish on roadsides
- 3. Improve appearance of streetscapes in towns and suburban areas

#### **Community Voices**

"Road conditions are appalling, verges overgrown, fire risk everywhere on council land that is not maintained."

"Tidying up the road verges so less fire danger and help with appearance. Weed control on the road verges and shire land to help prevent the spread of weeds. Protruding trees to be pruned beyond the white guide posts so we can pass other vehicles safely."

"Road sweeping. Our area appears not to be on any sort of schedule. The build up of debris on the road is large and been there so long it has vegetation growing out of it.

This is on sealed roads."

"The Shire needs to clean their verges not expect ratepayers to maintain side verges these are a disgrace."

"Upgrade community areas. Improve grounds of weeds and rubbish."

"Keeping verges and drains tidy upkeep."

"Pruning and care of verges/public open spaces."

"Serpentine town and street scape."

"Taking over the forgotten Whitby estates maintenance. Weeding. Fire breaks.

Kerbside maintenance. Rubbish."

"Developing areas streetscapes need to be up kept better. Shire seems to rely on developers to build the streetscapes and parks and then let them deteriorate to unfinished, rubbish riddled pockets with snapped off trees and supports left lying on the ground for weeks on end."



## Community Action Plan Bulk waste / rubbish

#### **Challenges**

- No verge collections
- Waste depot is hard to access

#### **Community Driven Actions**

- Reinstate verge collections
- 2. Reinstate tip passes

#### **Community Voices**

"Hardwaste collection has been terrible. Now that is stopped, and I have no access to the tip with no tow bar or trailer. People should be given access to a skip bin/year. Also it should be free for all tip requirements so no dumping in the Shire."

"As a single parent with no trailer I now cannot get rid of my bulk rubbish with the collections being cancelled."

"And now the kerbside pick ups are being cancelled. Where was the consultation with residents regarding that?"

"I think more community consultation regarding the removal of yearly verge collections would have been helpful to everyone to know about it."

"Removed bulk waste collections, I am disabled. I can't take my waste to the walk-in road transfer station."

"Bring back bulk waste pick up...The waste collection was always good now that's removed."

"The inability to get free tip passes - why can't we have the as we need them and then the tip charges the Shire as used - not give every resident one if they don't need them. Or the verge collection, but instead we have to drive to Mundijong to drop off waste."

"Verge collection has been taken away and rates are still the same, no reduction."

"Bulk rubbish or tip passes, or at least trailer access if we have

to dump our own bulk rubbish."

"Tip passes - for the price we pay in rates you would think this is included when other councils provide this to their residents."

## Footpaths, trails and cycleways

#### **Challenges**

- Footpaths are broken, overgrown and there is lack of maintenance
- Children's crossings and footpaths near school are dangerous
- Unkempt bridal trails
- Lack of signage on paths, trails and cycleways

#### **Community Driven Actions**

- Add new footpaths and cycleways where needed
- 2. Maintain existing footpath, trail and cycleway network

#### **Community Voices**

"Bridle paths for horse owners."

"More upkeep of bridle paths, signs need updating."

"Bridle paths are not properly maintained and have been allowed to deteriorate and are unsafe and unsuitable for purpose. They are a disgrace!"

"Footpaths need to be replaced/installed."

"More cycling paths."

"Footpaths/walkways - extremely unsafe paths along SW Hwy especially walking a pram - improve safety so they can be used more frequently."

"Fixing footpaths in central."

"Maintaining safe footpaths."

"Foot paths for walking and bike riding including gopher access and prams. They are in absolutely terrible condition on South West Highway around the shops complex."

"Foot path on left side of South Western Hwy for the school children to use from scarp for Byford Primary. Reality is they are not going to cross the road twice, so they walk in the dirt."

"Remember Oakford a forgotten area ... give decent footpaths."

"Provide cycleways so as to encourage people to get out and have a bike ride to be healthy, unable to cycle on the roads as it is far to dangerous."

"The Shire only looks after the new areas; the old areas still have no footpaths."

## Safety and security

#### **Challenges**

- Increase in crime and antisocial behaviour
- Hooning
- Lack of Police presence

#### **Community Driven Actions**

- 1. Need more Police; 24hr station
- 2. Increase lighting and camera use to deter anti-social behaviour and catch perpetrators

#### **Community Voices**

"I have lived in the area for over 25 years and it used to be a great place to live. Now it's not such a great place to live due to crime in the area due to more and more people moving here."

"I want less crime as we are getting idiots coming through here."

"Something that the Beenyup Grove people have expressed on our Facebook page is cameras at the estate entrance to help catch people hooning in the estate. Maybe catch a few of the people breaking in."

"Hooning to be stopped."

"More community Policing would be good as well, as the amount of accidents and speeding that occurs within residential areas."

"Recent events such as firebomb and break ins show us that our street is not safe."

"I live near the Ballawarra reserve, It is well maintained by the Shire, however I have noticed that it would benefit from lighting for safety and to deter antisocial behaviour at night."

"Police station to be man[ned] 24 hours a day; robber[s] don't work just 9-4 daily."

"The crime.... Now it's terrible, so much crime in the Shire. Need more police."

"It used to be a nice place to live and bring up kids. The crime has risen dramatically and when the train station comes the place will become just as bad as Armadale."


"I would really love to see a joint venture with Police to target [hooning], off road motorbikes and rubbish removal around the winging dam. It's appalling. People need to be caught and fined."
























